





What is payroll giving?

Payroll giving is a voluntary scheme that allows you to make regular donations to Child Cancer Foundation directly from your pay. You choose the amount to donate and frequency of the donation, and it will be taken out of your pay before it goes into your account.

If you donate over \$5, you will receive an immediate tax credit of 33% towards your PAYE. This means that while Child Cancer Foundation will benefit from the full donation amount, you will receive a third of it back. You won't be issued a receipt for your payroll donation and you don't need to do anything at the end of the tax year, as you've already received the tax credits in the form of reduced PAYE.



How to set up payroll giving

Good news! Your employer is already set up on payroll giving. If you want to join in the scheme, all you need to do is provide your payroll department the below information:

- The amount you want to donate
- How often you would like to donate e.g. fortnightly, monthly

And that's it! Your employer will go ahead and get you all set up, and there is nothing else you need to do. Your donation and tax credits for payroll donations will show in your wage records and on your pay slips.

Why donate to Child Cancer Foundation?

Finding out your child has cancer turns your life upside down. It happens to more than three Kiwi families every week. None of them ever thought it would happen to their child.

Cancer doesn't care about these children or their families. Child Cancer Foundation does. We support them every step of the way, whatever the outcome, for however long it takes.

We focus on the whānau, not the cancer. No two families' experiences are the same, and neither is the nature of the support they need. One thing is always the same, though. We support every family to concentrate on the most important thing of all: loving and caring for their child.
